CZECH GOVT COALITION INDICATES

The Czech government coalition politicians have indicated that they would not mind senior opposition Social Democrat (CSSD) chairman Jiri Paroubek becoming lower house chairman, but Prime Minister Mirek Topolánek stressed he has not offered it to Paroubek yet.

Topolánek, chairman of the Civic Democrats (ODS), today said this matter had not yet been discussed with the opposition.

Paroubek has so far commented on the option with reservations.

"I think that I am really not interested in this matter for the moment," Paroubek told ČTK, being asked whether the CSSD is considering the respective change in the post of Chamber of Deputies head which is now occupied by Miloš Věček (CSSD).

Věček indicated today that he was prepared to leave the post, but he said he did not like that his party colleague did not discuss the step with him.

"I would like to hear something from somebody because this concerns me," Věček said, hinting that CSSD politicians were negotiating behind his back.

Věček was elected to the post during the stalemate after the 2006 elections in which the ODS narrowly won. However, neither the centre-right coalition led by the ODS nor the leftist opposition held a majority in the lower house. The coalition then did not accept Paroubek as lower house chairman and Věček was finally chosen as a "temporary" chairman to prevent a parliamentary crisis.

The daily Mlada fronta Dnes

(MfD) reported today that the post of lower house chairman for Paroubek could be part of a broader agreement between the ODS and the CSSD, which would secure a "ceasefire" during the upcoming Czech EU presidency in the first half of 2009.

Topolánek said today he had not given Paroubek any similar offer. "I only admitted that this alternative was possible," he said.

Mirek Topolánek mentioned this possibility in a Czech Television (CT) discussion programme on Sunday.

Topolánek said a change at the Chamber of Deputies' helm would be also connected with the CSSD's victory in the regional election after which some CSSD deputies would leave the lower house to become regional governors. Junior ruling Christian Democrats (KDU-ČSL) chairman Jiri Cuhák pointed out that the post of lower house chairman is already filled

with a Social Democrat on the basis of valid agreements.

"If the strongest opposition party [CSSD] says it wants someone else in the post, it is up to us whether we will respect it or not. I think this can be respected," Cuhák added.

CSSD deputy group head Michal Hasek, who is to depart from the lower house to become new governor of the South Moravia Region, refused to comment on possible changes in the Chamber leadership at all.

CzechRep has spent 3.054 billion for EU presidency

Prague ČTK - The Czech EU presidency in January-June has cost the Czech Republic 3.054 billion crowns, including preparations, to date, European Affairs Minister Štefan Füle said in reply to a question by Gabriela Kalabková (Social Democrats, CSSD), in the Chamber of Deputies today. He said a number of invoices are still being paid and that the final accounting report is to be available in end-October.

According to previous calculations, the final sum should be somewhere around 3.3 billion crowns.

"I do not suppose that the presidency cost would exceed the originally considered 3.3 billion crowns," Füle said.

The Czech Republic took over the EU presidency from France and handed it to Sweden.

The Digital Era: the CD is now on life support

Don't think the compact discs in your car or in the box in the attic are going to become relics... any time soon that is. While the CD is dying a slow death, it may still have enough fans out there to keep it on life support for some time. From illegal downloads through the old Napster to Apple's revolutionary iTunes store, how we get our music has dramatically changed since the new millennium. And while many of us would easily abandon our CD collection in exchange for a fully-loaded iPod, Country Music Television's Calvin Gilbert says one group of music lovers isn't quite as anxious as the rock crowd to embrace digital downloads.

"Country music fans are definitely the ones that are still giving CDs their much-needed lifeline, because 65% of people between the ages of 18-54 are still 'CD-Dominant.' And when you compare that against sales statistics on Carrie Underwood's last record, that still means a lot of physical product is being moved and bought."

While record companies and the likes of brick-and-mortar record stores scramble to revise their dated business models to remain current and afloat, as long as that CD at your local HMV is being still being snapped up, Gilbert says don't expect the labels to provide their entire catalogue in online music stores just yet.

"Remember, when the compact disc started taking over for cassette tapes in the early 90s? It wasn't really until the early 2000s that CD players were replacing tape decks in cars. But even then, cassettes dropped from some 442 million in 1990 to only 274,000 by 2008, so they're still out there today. It's pretty safe to say that while the CD is being phased out, it's far too early to write its obituary."

The mystery of 20 years Old photograph is over

Prague - It is one of the most famous photographs that went around Germany as well as Europe, symbolizing the fall of the Berlin Wall as well as communism in the Old Continent.

It captures a citizen of former East Germany climbing over a fence of West Germany's embassy in Prague. It happened on October 2, 1989. A Czechoslovak policeman is trying to take the man down but in vain.

The name of the man who succeeded in his escape is Michael Fleischmann and he was among the thousands of Germans that decided to flee the totalitarian regime by climbing over the West Germany's embassy fence in Prague.

In June, this year Mr. Fleischmann published an announcement stating he would like to meet the policeman.

Now, symbolically, on the day

that Germany is commemorating the 20 years of freedom by organizing the Freedom Train, the mystery of the famous photograph is over.

The Institute for Study of Totalitarian Regimes had identified the man as "the embassy policeman" and helped Aktuálně.cz to track down the man.

He is 47 years old and still works in the police force. "I do recall we used to serve by the embassy but is that really me?" was his first response.
